




Q1 - Why did you take this course? (Student can select up to 3 responses)

Q3 - How would you evaluate your own commitment to and engagement with this course?






As a senior political science and public policy major, a lot of the information I had already learned in other classes just not with a sociological lens.

syllabus was easy to follow and had everything that we would ever need


Very interesting books to read. Did a great job of backing up what was being taught in class.

Good mixture of lectures and class participation.



I liked the length of the essays we wrote about the books and for the midterm. They made me write in a concise manner about the topic but still go into some depth.




Comments


I think she did the best she could with a fully virtual class.
