




**Q1 - Why did you take this course? (Student can select up to 3 responses)**




Selection of curriculum offered a lot.

**Q5 - How helpful were the course materials used by the instructor?**







In one of my other classes the powerpoints are posted ahead but in a format with lines next to each slide for where we can take notes and it makes it a lot easier to follow along.



Q8 - How would you rate the instructor's performance in providing fair, prompt, and helpful comments and grades on your work?




